BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Huntsville shall commit an amount sufficient to meet the 40% matching fund requirement for the Grant which may be awarded to the City pursuant to such application, and not less than \$200,000.00, the amount of the City's maintenance of effort requirement, said funds to be identified in the City's fiscal year 2025 and 2026 budgets for such use.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the event that such grant is awarded, the Mayor of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, is hereby authorized, requested, and directed, on behalf of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, to enter into such grant agreement with the Environmental Protection Agency and to submit such supporting and collateral materials as required.
