AGREEMENT FOR CITY OF HUNTSVILLE WASTEWATER COST OF SERVICE STUDY

This Agreement is made this 13th day of , July 2023, by and among the City of Huntsville, Alabama, a municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "City") and Jackson Thornton & Co. PC, an Alabama professional corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Jackson Thornton" or "Consultant) for a professional services related to revenue Requirements Analysis and Cost of service/rate study for the City's sewer system. The City and Jackson Thornton hereby agree as follows:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City desires to have a professional study and analysis of its wastewater treatment rates in order to determine the correct levels for said rates; and

WHEREAS, Jackson Thornton has extensive experience and expertise in performing this type of study for public utilities.

WITNESSETH

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants, herein contained, the parties hereby agree as follows, to wit:

- 1. **Scope of Work:** The Scope of Work is as described in Attachment 1 hereto, and more particularly in Exhibit 3 of Attachment 1.
- 2. **Period of Performance and Schedule:** Jackson Thornton shall commence performance of the Work within ninety (90) days of the approval of this Agreement by the Huntsville City Council and shall complete the Work of this Agreement according to Exhibit 3 of Attachment 1. The schedule and price will be per the multi-year price quoted in Exhibit 3.

- 3. <u>Contract Price:</u> In consideration of the services rendered hereunder, the City shall pay to Jackson Thornton for the work performed per the Scope of Work shall be Twentysix Thousand Dollars (\$26,000.00) for Study 1, Twenty-eight Thousand Dollars (\$28,000.00) for Study 2 and Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for Study 3. The total amount of this agreement shall not exceed Eighty-four Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$84,300.00)
- 4. <u>Jackson Thornton Associates Performing as an Independent Contractor:</u> In the performance of this work it is understood between the parties that Jackson Thornton and its employees, agents, subcontractors and consultants, if any, shall be acting as independent contractors and not as an employee of the City of Huntsville. Jackson Thornton shall have no authority to obligate the City to an indebtedness or other obligation.
- 5. Notices: All notices (a) shall be in writing, (b) shall be deemed served on the date which they are actually received, and (c) shall be served by (i) personal delivery, or (ii) United States First Class Certified or Registered Mail, Return Receipt Requested, properly addressed with postage prepaid or (iii) a nationally recognized overnight courier/delivery service (i.e. Federal Express, United Parcel Service, etc.) or (iv) electronic transmission ("E-mail") or telephonic facsimile transmission ("Fax") in conjunction with one of the other methods of delivery set forth in subparagraphs (i), (ii) or (iii), each addressed as follows:

- 6. <u>Subcontracting:</u> Jackson Thornton may not associate/hire/contract with any subcontractor/independent contractor/consultant in order to fulfill the requirements of this Agreement without obtaining the prior written approval of the City's Project Manager. Jackson Thornton shall be solely responsible for any and all payments/wages/earnings due any such independent contractor for work performed thereby in furtherance of this Agreement. Jackson Thornton shall be legally responsible for any and all actions of any subcontractor/independent contractor/consultant. Consent by the City to any subcontract shall not constitute approval of the acceptability of any subcontract price or of any amount paid under any subcontract, nor relieve Jackson Thornton of any responsibility for performing this contract. The City's Project Manager shall have final approval of any proposed subcontractor.
- 7. <u>Confidential Information:</u> Each party hereto (each, a "Recipient") shall protect and keep confidential all non-public information disclosed to Recipient by the other party (each, a "Discloser") and identified as confidential by Discloser ("Confidential Information) and shall not.

except as may be authorized by Discloser in writing, use or disclose any such Confidential Information during and after the term of this Agreement. These obligations of confidentiality shall not apply to information that: (1) was previously known to Recipient; (ii) is or becomes publicly available through no fault of Recipient; (iii) is disclosed to Recipient by a third party having no obligation of confidentiality to Discloser relating to such Confidential Information; (iv) is independently configured by Recipient; or (v) is required to be disclosed as a matter of law (e.g. open records request).

8. Termination

(1) Termination for Convenience.

This agreement may be terminated by the City without cause prior to the completion of the project upon ten (10) days written notice of the intent to terminate to Jackson Thornton. Notice to terminate shall be given to Jackson Thornton by written notification mailed or hand delivered to the contact address for Jackson Thornton listed in Section 5 herein. In the event of such termination without cause, Jackson Thornton shall be compensated for all services actually performed in a timely manner prior to receipt of the notice of termination provided, however, that such compensation shall be conditioned upon Jackson Thornton providing in a timely manner to the City all documents developed and copies of the work product produced pursuant to the Contract which were performed in furtherance of the Scope or Work up to the receipt of the notice of termination. In such event, Jackson Thornton shall promptly submit the City its invoice for final payment.

(2) Termination for Cause.

This agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other should such other party fail substantially to perform in accordance with its material terms through no fault of the party initiating the termination.

- 9. <u>Nonexclusiveness of Remedies.</u> Any right or remedy on behalf of the City or Jackson Thornton provided for in any of these specifications, including but not limited to any guaranty or warranty or any remedy for nonperformance, shall be in addition to and not a limitation of any right or remedy otherwise available by law, equity, or statute.
- 10. <u>Injuries to Jackson Thornton.</u> Jackson Thornton is obligated to obtain sufficient liability insurance coverage (as well as worker's compensation coverage, if required by law) for the benefit of Jackson Thornton and its agents and/or employees. Jackson Thornton waives any and all rights to recovery from the City for any injuries that Jackson Thornton (and/or its agents and/or employees) may sustain while performing services under this Agreement.

11. **GENERAL PROVISIONS.**

A. Governing Law and Venue.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Alabama without regard to Alabama conflict of laws provisions. Proper venue for any action to

enforce the terms of this Agreement shall be in the state or federal courts of Madison County, Alabama.

B. Force Majeure.

Neither party shall be responsible for delays or failure of performance resulting from acts beyond the reasonable control of such party. Such acts shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, strikes, walkouts, riots, acts of war, epidemics, failure of suppliers to perform, governmental regulations, power failure(s), earthquakes, or other disasters.

C. Headings.

The titles and headings of the various sections and paragraphs in this Agreement are intended solely for convenience of reference and are not intended for any other purpose whatsoever, or to explain, modify or place any construction upon or on any of the provisions of the Agreement.

D. Agreement Deemed to Have Been Jointly Drafted.

The parties acknowledge that they have thoroughly reviewed this Agreement and bargained over its terms. Accordingly, neither party shall be considered responsible for the preparation of this Agreement which shall be deemed to have been prepared jointly by both parties. The provisions of the Agreement allocate the risks between the parties. The terms and conditions included herein reflect the allocation of risk, and each provision herein is a part of the bargained for consideration of this Agreement.

E. Waiver.

The failure of the City to insist in one or more instances upon the performance of any term of this Agreement is not a waiver of its right to future performance of such terms unless such waiver is in writing and signed by a duly authorized officer of the City.

F. All Amendments in Writing.

No provisions in either party's purchase orders, or in any other business forms employed by either party will supersede the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and no supplement, modification, or amendment of this Agreement shall be binding, unless executed in writing by a duly authorized representative of each party to this Agreement.

G. Property of City.

All work product prepared by Jackson Thornton shall become and be the sole property of the City.

H. Third Parties.

Nothing contained herein shall create a contractual relationship with, or any rights in favor of, any third party.

I. Non Discrimination Policy.

In consideration of this agreement, the parties hereto for themselves, their agents, officials, employees, and servants agree not to discriminate in any manner on the basis of race, color, creed, age, sex, disability or national origin with reference to the subject matter of this agreement, no matter how remote.

J. No Assignment

Neither party shall assign its rights hereunder, excepting its right to payment, nor shall it delegate any of its duties hereunder without the written consent of the other party.

K. Entire Agreement.

The parties have read this Agreement, including all Exhibits, and agree to be bound by its terms, and further agree that it constitutes the complete and entire agreement of the parties and supersedes all previous communications, oral or written, and all other communications between them relating to the subject matter hereof. No representations or statements of any kind made by either party, which are not expressly stated herein, shall be binding on such party. In the event any separate Statements of Work are subsequently executed by the parties and are in conflict with the provisions of this Agreement, then the provisions of this Agreement shall prevail over any such conflicting provisions. Any pre-printed terms and conditions of Jackson Thornton's and City's business forms shall be without legal effect with respect to this Agreement or any subsequent Statements of Work.

L. Order of Precedence of Contract Documents

In the event any conflict, discrepancy, or inconsistency among any of the documents which make up this contract, the following shall control, and Jackson Thornton is deemed to have based its estimate of performing the work upon the order of precedence as set forth below. Interpretations shall be based upon the following order of precedence: 1) this Agreement and 2) Jackson Thornton's proposal attached hereto as Attachment A.

Section Four | Scope and Approach

A Partnership Approach

We will work with you and your management team to provide you with our opinion as to determine the adequacy and most appropriate structure for applicable user rates, fees and other charges assessed by the WPC for its services. No one likes surprises during a professional engagement. We will work proactively to identify issues early in the planning stages, and we will discuss the issues with you and your management team promptly. We are happy to present the results and findings at the conclusion of our engagement.

Project Objective

We understand from previous discussions with you and your management team that the objective of our work is to develop an analysis to determine the appropriate rates and costs of services supplied and distributed to the customers of WPC. In order to provide this analysis, meet the objectives of this engagement, and provide the results desired from this project, we propose that these projects be completed as a multi-phased process.

Phase I – Revenue Requirements Analysis "RRA" – This phase of the project includes working with the management team to review historical accounting and cost records for plant investment and expenditures. We will also review budgets (financial, capital requirements, cash flow, etc.) and bond indenture requirements in order to determine the projected revenue requirements of each utility service. After performing this RRA, we will know if the current rates will generate the needed revenue requirements for each class of service provided and for the system.

- Phase II <u>PART 1 Prepare Embedded Wastewater Cost of Service Study "COSS"</u> This phase
 of the project includes working with your management team to perform a detailed allocation of the
 distribution plant, operating expenses, debt service and capital improvement projects to each rate
 class. From this phase we can determine if rate equity exists between rate classes and within rate
 classes. The results of this COSS will provide the support for any changes in WPC's rates, if any
 are needed.
 - <u>PART 2 Prepare Preliminary Rate Designs for Each Rate Class</u> The second part of this phase includes using the COSS results to determine what changes in current rates are needed to generate the revenues desired from each rate class. After preliminary rates have been determined for each rate class, analysis can be prepared reflecting existing rates versus proposed rates and total revenues generated by each different rate class.
- Phase III <u>Revenue Requirement Projections</u> This phase will involve an assessment of Revenue Requirements Analysis and anticipated future revenues. This will include reviewing the funding requirements for future capital expenditures, reserve funding, debt funding and O&M, as developed in the WPC financial planning model.
- Phase IV <u>Rate Comparison</u> This phase will involve comparing the system's current and proposed rates to other systems as requested by WPC.
- Phase V Reporting At the conclusion of the engagement, JTUC will provide the following deliverables:
 - Electronic and printed/bound copy of the COSS
 - o PowerPoint Board/Council Presentation
 - Executive Summary

Project Procedure Standards

The procedures employed by JTUC follow generally accepted cost of service principles. Our model is flexible to compensate for individual accounting practices. As a guideline, our water and wastewater models follow the allocation processes detailed in the M-1 Manual ("Principles of Water Rates, Fees and Charges prescribed by the American Water Works Association"). Revenue requirements will be calculated using the Cash Method, unless otherwise desired. JTUC has developed a comprehensive Cost of Service model that allows Management and WPC to explore any study variations desired.

We will provide an information request form prior to the first on-site meeting. The timely and accurate completion of this request is essential to our completion of the services described above.

During the course of our engagement, we may accumulate records containing data that should be reflected in WPC's books and records. WPC will determine that all such data, if necessary, will be so reflected. Accordingly, WPC will not expect us to maintain copies of such records in our possession.

Confirmation of Management Responsibilities

Mr. Shane Cook, Director, will oversee our services, and you have indicated that you possess suitable skill, knowledge, and experience to understand the services to be performed sufficiently to oversee them. You have also agreed that you will assume all management responsibilities for subject matter and scope of the services under this arrangement letter. You have agreed to evaluate the adequacy and results of our services performed and you accept responsibility for the results and ultimate use of the services.

Section Five | Project Fees

Our projected time and effort for an embedded COS/Rate Study as described above is \$39,000 for a single-year engagement. A significant part of the cost is building the allocation models to fit your individual system and getting all data in the proper format. We believe the value of building this model benefits WPC over multiple years, if used by management. Consequently, to receive the multi-year benefits, we offer a multi-engagement pricing alternative allowing the model to be updated with new data. Doing so allows us to defer the upfront costs of building the model over multiple engagements. Should you desire, we can spread these upfront costs over a three-engagement contract. The three-engagement proposal does not require you to complete the work in three successive calendar years. We would request the contract period not to exceed seven (7) years.

Under the multi-year pricing alternative, JTUC proposes to cap the fees at the following:

Study 1	\$26,000
Study 2	\$28,000
Study 3	\$30,300
Total	\$84,300

Our price includes the development of cost curves by rate class and the comparison of current to proposed rates. Our price includes three (3) meetings with management or the council; however, this price does not include time required to meet with potential customers or opposition parties for rate approval. We will assist management of WPC with meetings based on their desires at our hourly rates for expert testimony and support, should it be required. Please see Exhibit 4 for current hourly rates and expert testimony rates.


All fees are based on the understanding that WPC will provide JTUC the data needed on a timely basis. JTUC will furnish the staff of WPC with an "information request" form prior to the first on-site meeting. All reasonable travel and out-of-pocket expenses will be billed at cost. The above fees do not include travel time, which will be billed at one-half our standard billing rates and capped to six (6) hours per person, per round trip.

Any changes to the project (change of test year, financial projections, rate classes, billing data, etc.) after initial criteria are set will require a change order. JTUC will provide an estimate as to the cost of any of these changes, and will receive approval by your management before proceeding.

Our fees for these services will be billed periodically as the work progresses. Such bills are payable on presentation and a late charge of 1½ % per month will be imposed for any portion of the billed amount not paid within 30 days of the bill date. We reserve the right to suspend our work and/or to terminate our engagement if any bill is not paid in full within 30 days of the bill date. We anticipate that the staff involved in the Cost of Service Study project will primarily be Jim Marshall, Sarah Chandler, and Ryan Shubird. Sarah will be the principal-in-charge and Jim will also serve as a principal on this project. We have additional professional staff dedicated to utility accounting and consulting that we can call upon if needed.

James B. Marshall, III, the principal responsible for electric, natural gas, water and sewer utility Cost of Service/Rate Study work, has worked with utilities for more than 15 years. During that time, he has provided financial forecasting, cost of service, and rate design consulting projects for utilities throughout the southeast. Jim has also worked with manufacturing and commercial companies across the country on tax issues and utility negotiations. He is certified by the Association of Energy Engineers as an Energy Procurement Professional. Jim currently serves on AWWA's Rates and Charges Committee as well as the Co-Chair of the Utility Finance Management Committee for the Kentucky/Tennessee section of AWWA. Jim is recognized as a qualified expert by the Utility Management Review Board and the Water and Wastewater Financing Board to provide consulting and financial guidance to Tennessee utilities.

Sarah V. Chandler, also a principal, has more than 20 years of experience in the utilities industry in the areas of cost of service, rate design, and regulation. She also has rate design and cost of service experience with a large interstate natural gas pipeline. She has completed training classes for financial planning, rates, fees, and charges sponsored by AWWA. Sarah serves on AWWA's Finance, Accounting, and Management Controls Committee. Sarah is recognized as a qualified expert by the Utility Management Review Board

and the Water and Wastewater Financing Board to provide consulting and financial guidance to Tennessee utilities.

Ryan Shubird has worked in the utility industry for more than 6 years, providing services in cost of service studies, rate design, and financial forecasting. He has received training in cost of service, rate design and financial planning. He has led a financial forecasting modeling class to demonstrate the importance of forecasting as a financial planning tool. Ryan is a Certified Public Accountant who obtains 40 plus hours of continuing professional education annually.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE

We understand from previous discussions with you and your management team that the objective of our work is to develop an analysis to determine the appropriate rates and costs of services supplied and distributed to the customers of WPC. In order to provide this analysis, meet the objectives of this engagement, and provide the results desired from this project, we propose that these projects be completed as a multi-phased process.

- Phase I Revenue Requirements Analysis "RRA" This phase of the project includes working with the management team to review historical accounting and cost records for plant investment and expenditures. We will also review budgets (financial, capital requirements, cash flow, etc.) and bond indenture requirements in order to determine the projected revenue requirements of each utility service. After performing this RRA, we will know if the current rates will generate the needed revenue requirements for each class of service provided and for the system.
- Phase II <u>PART 1 Prepare Embedded Wastewater Cost of Service Study "COSS"</u> This phase of the project includes working with your management team to perform a detailed allocation of the distribution plant, operating expenses, debt service and capital improvement projects to each rate class. From this phase we can determine if rate equity exists between rate classes and within rate classes. The results of this COSS will provide the support for any changes in WPC's rates, if any are needed.
 - <u>PART 2 Prepare Preliminary Rate Designs for Each Rate Class</u> The second part of this phase includes using the COSS results to determine what changes in current rates are needed to generate the revenues desired from each rate class. After preliminary rates have been determined for each rate class, analysis can be prepared reflecting existing rates versus proposed rates and total revenues generated by each different rate class.
- Phase III <u>Revenue Requirement Projections</u> This phase will involve an assessment of Revenue Requirements Analysis and anticipated future revenues. This will include reviewing the funding requirements for future capital expenditures, reserve funding, debt funding and O&M, as developed in the WPC financial planning model.
- Phase IV <u>Rate Comparison</u> This phase will involve comparing the system's current and proposed rates to other systems as requested by WPC.
- Phase V Reporting At the conclusion of the engagement, JTUC will provide the following deliverables:

- Electronic and printed/bound copy of the COSS
- o PowerPoint Board/Council Presentation
- Executive Summary

PROJECT PROCEDURES STANDARDS

The procedures employed by JTUC follow generally accepted cost of service principles. Our model is flexible to compensate for individual accounting practices. As a guideline, our water and wastewater models follow the allocation processes detailed in the M-1 Manual ("Principles of Water Rates, Fees and Charges prescribed by the American Water Works Association"). Revenue requirements will be calculated using the Cash Method, unless otherwise desired. JTUC has developed a comprehensive Cost of Service model that allows Management and WPC to explore any study variations desired.

We will provide an information request form prior to the first on-site meeting. The timely and accurate completion of this request is essential to our completion of the services described above.

During the course of our engagement, we may accumulate records containing data that should be reflected in WPC's books and records. WPC will determine that all such data, if necessary, will be so reflected. Accordingly, WPC will not expect us to maintain copies of such records in our possession.

CONFIRMATION OF MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY

Mr. Shane Cook, Director, will oversee our services, and you have indicated that you possess suitable skill, knowledge, and experience to understand the services to be performed sufficiently to oversee them. You have also agreed that you will assume all management responsibilities for subject matter and scope of the services under this arrangement letter. You have agreed to evaluate the adequacy and results of our services performed and you accept responsibility for the results and ultimate use of the services.

PROJECT FEES

Our projected time and effort for an embedded COS/Rate Study as described above is \$39,000 for a single-year engagement. A significant part of the cost is building the allocation models to fit your individual system and getting all data in the proper format. We believe the value of building this model benefits WPC over multiple years, if used by management. Consequently, to receive the multi-year benefits, we offer a multi-engagement pricing alternative allowing the model to be updated with new data. Doing so allows us to defer the upfront costs of building the model over multiple engagements. Should you desire, we can spread these upfront costs over a three-engagement contract. The three-engagement proposal does not require you to complete the work in three successive calendar years. We would request the contract period not to exceed seven (7) years.

Under the multi-year pricing alternative, JTUC proposes to cap the fees at the following:

Our price includes the development of cost curves by rate class and the comparison of current to proposed rates. Our price includes three (3) meetings with management or the council; however, this price does not include time required to meet with potential customers or opposition parties for rate approval. We will assist management of WPC with meetings based on their desires at our hourly rates for expert testimony and support, should it be required. Please see Exhibit 4 for current hourly rates and expert testimony rates.

All fees are based on the understanding that WPC will provide JTUC the data needed on a timely basis. JTUC will furnish the staff of WPC with an "information request" form prior to the first on-site meeting. All reasonable travel and out-of-pocket expenses will be billed at cost. The above fees do not include travel time, which will be billed at one-half our standard billing rates and capped to six (6) hours per person, per round trip.

Any changes to the project (change of test year, financial projections, rate classes, billing data, etc.) after initial criteria are set will require a change order. JTUC will provide an estimate as to the cost of any of these changes, and will receive approval by your management before proceeding.

Our fees for these services will be billed periodically as the work progresses. Such bills are payable on presentation and a late charge of 1½ % per month will be imposed for any portion of the billed amount not paid within 30 days of the bill date. We reserve the right to suspend our work and/or to terminate our engagement if any bill is not paid in full within 30 days of the bill date. In the event of suspension of our work or termination of our engagement, such work shall not be resumed and such engagement shall not be reinstated, as the case may be, until the account balance and all late charges are paid in full.

This engagement may be terminated by either party, without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice. In the event you terminate this engagement, you will pay us for all services rendered (including deliverables and products delivered), expenses incurred, and noncancelable commitments made by us on your behalf through the effective date of termination.

CLAIM RESOLUTION

It is agreed by WPC and Jackson Thornton & Co., P.C. or any successors in interest that no claim arising out of services rendered pursuant to this agreement by or on behalf of WPC shall be asserted more than two years after the date of the last report issued by Jackson Thornton & Co., P.C.

JT and WPC each acknowledge that there are risks involved with communicating and storing data via electronic means. Accordingly, to the fullest extent permitted by law, JT and WPC each waive and acknowledge that neither party shall have any claim against the other based upon, relating to, or arising from the use of electronic systems (including, but not limited to, email and cloud computing systems). Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, neither party shall be liable for any damages arising from any and all data breaches, the delivery of communications, data, or documents to unintended recipients, or the interception or viewing of communications, data, or documents by unintended or unauthorized individuals or entities.

ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES AND COUNTERPARTS

Each party hereto agrees that any electronic signature of a party to this Agreement or any electronic signature to a document contemplated thereby (including any representation letter) is intended to authenticate such writing and shall be as valid, and have the same force and effect, as a manual signature. Any such electronically signed document shall be deemed (i) to be "written" or "in writing," (ii) to have been signed, and (iii) to constitute a record established and maintained in the ordinary course of business and an original written record when printed from electronic files. Each party hereto also agrees that electronic delivery of a signature to any such document (via email or otherwise) shall be as effective as manual delivery of a manual signature. For purposes hereof, "electronic signature" includes, but is not limited to, (i) a scanned copy ((as a "pdf" (portable document format) or other replicating image)) of a manual ink signature, (ii) an electronic copy of a traditional signature affixed to a document, (iii) a signature incorporated into a document utilizing touchscreen capabilities, or (iv) a digital signature. This Agreement may be

executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be considered an original instrument, but all of which shall be considered one and the same agreement. Paper copies or "printouts," of such documents, if introduced as evidence in any judicial, arbitral, mediation or administrative proceeding, will be admissible as between the parties to the same extent and under the same conditions as other original business records created and maintained in documentary form. Neither party shall contest the admissibility of true and accurate copies of electronically signed documents on the basis of the best evidence rule or as not satisfying the business records exception to the hearsay rule, statute of frauds, or any other evidentiary objection or theory premised upon the execution and/or delivery of the document by electronic means.

Any and all documents executed by electronic signatures shall be retained in a readily accessible format in accordance with the respective party's document retention policy. In the event that either party shall lose or otherwise be unable to produce its original document, such party may request the other party to produce the original document in whatever format it is currently stored, and reimburse the producing party for its cost and expense incurred in providing such documents.


