BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, that Budget Ordinance No. 22-736, adopted and approved on September 22, 2022, is hereby amended as follows:

In the 1% LODGING TAX 2013 FUND:

Increase the special appropriation to the Huntsville/Madison County Convention and Visitors Bureau from the 1% Lodging Tax Revenue, with the expenditure pending the event requirements:

- \$15,500.00 for support of the National Academic Advising Association Region 4 Conference.
- \$6,600.00 for support of the U.S. Youth Soccer Midsouth Conference Tournament.

Authorize the Huntsville/Madison County Convention and Visitors Bureau to commit \$325,000.00 (5 years/\$65K per year) from the 1% Lodging Tax Revenue (2013 Lodging Tax Recruitment Committee) for support of the Tiger Rock Martial Arts World events.

Increase the special appropriation to the Sports Commission from the 1% Lodging Tax Revenue, with the expenditure pending the event requirements:
