**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HUNTSVILLE FOR A
FY 2026 USDOT SAFE STREETS & ROADS FOR ALL (SS4A)
GRANT APPLICATION for the
CITY OF HUNTSVILLE SAFE CROSSINGS PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the City of Huntsville is committed to ensuring the safety of its citizens and is committed to reaching Vision Zero, or zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries by 2055.

WHEREAS, the City of Huntsville has identified High Injury Networks (HIN) within its jurisdiction through the comprehensive Safety Action Plan process.

WHEREAS, the City of Huntsville is eligible to apply to the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) for Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant funding, and will apply for SS4A Implementation funding for the *City of Huntsville Safe Crossings Program*.

Memorial Parkway (US 431/231) serves as the major north-south arterial for the city of Huntsville that also provides local access to major commercial, residential, and recreational hubs along the corridor via its frontage roads. It has also been identified as one of the city's top High-Injury Networks (HIN) and a barrier for families trying to access significant cultural resources, such as the John Hunt Park Sports District, a booming parks and rec sports destination for the region.

The City of Huntsville Safe Crossings Program includes intersection improvements at twelve intersections along the Memorial Parkway corridor, providing safer multimodal access to schools, neighborhoods, parks, and commercial destinations throughout the city. This program provides safe connections to family activities along approximately thirteen miles of the corridor.

WHEREAS, engineers have estimated the Total Project Cost for Implementation activities to be \$6,455,572.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, that the Council authorizes the Mayor to submit an application on behalf of the City of Huntsville, including all the understandings and assurances contained therein, to the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) for Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Implementation grant funding not to exceed \$5,164,457, or eighty percent (80%) of the Total Project Cost for the *City of Huntsville Safe Crossings Program*, and is committed to provide a twenty (20%) match of \$1,291,115.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall become effective immediately upon approval and adoption by the Council, the public welfare requiring it.
