WHEREAS, Jazz McKenzie began her professional singing career in 2018, debuting at R&B Vibes Live in Huntsville, Alabama, and quickly became known for her soulful tone, emotional storytelling, and commanding stage presence; and

WHEREAS, Jazz McKenzie gained national recognition as a contestant on Season 28 of NBC's The Voice, advancing to the live finale and representing the City of Huntsville, Alabama A&M University, and the State of Alabama on an international stage; and

WHEREAS, Jazz McKenzie earned a rare four-chair turn during the Blind Auditions from coaches Reba McEntire, Niall Horan, Snoop Dogg, and Michael Bublé with her powerful rendition of Tina Turner's "What's Love Got to Do with It," and later delivered a standout performance of Journey's "Don't Stop Believin'," which her coach described as giving him "goosebumps"; and

WHEREAS, Jazz McKenzie's musical journey is rooted in faith, family, and community, and includes performances at Huntsville's Panoply Arts Festival and shared stages with acclaimed artists such as Doug E. Fresh, Chrisette Michele, Leela James, Avery Sunshine, and Kem; and

WHEREAS, Jazz McKenzie remains committed to uplifting and inspiring the next generation of artists through authenticity, musical excellence, and service to her community.
